


The Sower and the Seed (R=1.8)

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Do you have a favorite parable? If you're familiar with **Biblical literature** you've probably heard of "**The Parable of the Sower**" **told by Jesus**. As Jesus told the parable the seeds were just seeds and had no personality. But, in this short adaptation from the book of Mark the seeds come to life. There is no preaching and no interpretation in this free Readers Theater script--just plain fun.

TIME: almost 4 minutes CAST: 6-7 TONE: light with a potential serious punch
READABILITY: Grade 1.8 (grade 1.1 replacing "Narrator" with "Nat")

Here is an excerpt from this free Readers Theater script:
